# group work guidelines

- setup your group
- your group needs to be clearly defined – meeting the criteria set by the activity guideline
- how many people, what mix of skills or personalities would help the group function as a whole
- learn peoples' names



# group work guidelines

- discuss and clarify the goals of the group's work
- agree to work together well – be courteous, friendly and helpful to resolve situations
- determine if any special rules for the group need to be set
- brainstorm
- break up big jobs into smaller pieces
- do a fair division of work



# group work guidelines

- everyone is responsible to participate equally
- recognize that everyone has different skill sets and is capable of contribution
- personality can be challenging
- be professional – respect others



# group work guidelines

- organize what you have to do on a schedule and take on group work roles
- have a recorder that takes notes on what gets done, what is discussed
- have a moderator – someone to make sure everyone contributes their idea and effort



# group work guidelines

- set earlier deadlines – something you don't plan for happens all the time
- never assume everyone understands their share of the job or the big picture
- ask for assistance from the teacher only when the group is unable to problem-solve on its own



# group work guidelines



- if one person is having a hard time, the group should help them resolve the issue not by doing it for them, but giving them pointers
- behave as if everyone is going to mark your involvement and participation



# group work guidelines

- at the beginning of each work period class, decide what you will get accomplished
- think of the steps you'll need to go through to get to the goal



# group work guidelines

- take initiative
- discuss the task together so that everyone understands



# group work guidelines

- give only constructive comments when you want to improve things
- focus and listen to each other
- be reliable and communicate with your group members so they know what you are doing, to do your part



# group work guidelines

- get it done

# problems groups have

- while people think without focus, false starts and circular discussions happen that waste time
- sometimes groups rush into work without planning and have to go back and redo work or use up materials
- lack of motivation

# ● problems groups have

- members don't do what they say they're going to do, on time, or speak up when they don't understand what's required
- some members dominate and some people are reluctant to participate

# problems groups have

- people are distracted with interesting side stories
- members ignore or ridicule others sometimes resulting in feuds
